7 pm: Jerusalem, my dearest – opening concert

4 pm: *Gemstone. Tale-Oratorio for grown-ups*

In this performance, based on the Hasidic tale called Gemstone, the music of the **Chagall Band**, Yiddish songs, funny anecdotes and jokes play a very important role. The amusing and deep performance includes one of Chagall's poems and **Schein Gábor**, a contemporary Jewish poet's poem about Chagall. The music was composed by **Vincze Pál**, the member of

the Chagall Band, the music sometimes illuminates the story, sometimes, suddenly, becomes the part of it. Takács Nikolas is one of the best singers of his generation, he originates from Galanta, the
Slovakian town which belonged to Hungary and has a Hungarian minority population even
today, so for him it has a special importance to perform as a Hungarian singer in
Transkarpathia. While in 19, he performed together with the star of the international jazz-life,
Jávori Vilmos drummer. Due to his exceptional talent, Takács Nikolas performed together,
already in the very beginning of his career, with Babos Gyula, Horváth Charlie, Tony
Lakatos and Solti János. In Beregszász, he will perform together with Pál Dénes, the voice
